How do I join?

With a written testimony of your conversion experience, you may become a member of this church by a majority vote of the members, after being examined closely by the leadership of the church, having faithfully attended and participated in the life of the church for a minimum of three months, and after being presented to the church.

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STATEMENT OF BELIEFS

ABOUT GOD

God is the Creator and Ruler of the universe. He eternally exists in three persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. These three are co-equal and are one God. (Genesis 1:1,26,27; 3:22; Psalm 90:2; Matthew 28:19; 1 Peter 1:2; 2 Corinthians 13:14)

ABOUT THE FATHER

He is the first person of the Trinity. He gave His only Son that no one would perish. He is father to the fatherless. He has adopted us as children. He has made man through His son co-heirs of creation. No one can snatch His children from His hands. His fullness dwells in Jesus Christ. He is the defense of the poor and the oppressed.

(Psalms 68:5; James 1:17; John 3:16; John 1:13; Romans 8:15; 2 Corinthians 6:18; Ephesians 5:1)

ABOUT JESUS CHRIST

Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is fully God and fully man. Jesus lived a sinless human life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all men by dying on a cross. He is the friend of sinners. He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death. He ascended to Heaven's glory and will return again to earth to reign as King of Kings, and Lord of Lords. (Matthew 1:22,23; Isaiah 9:6; John 1:1-5, 14:10-30; Hebrews 4:14,15; 1 Corinthians 15:3,4; Romans 1:3,4; Acts 1:9-11; 1 Timothy 6:14,15; Titus 2:13; Philippians 2:5-11)

ABOUT THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit is equal with the Father and the Son as God. He is present in the world to empower men to be witnesses of man's need for Jesus Christ. He also lives in every Christian from the moment of salvation. He gives gifts to each believer to be used to administer God's grace to build up the body to the full measure of Christ. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. The Christian seeks to live under His filling daily, manifesting the fruit of the Holy Spirit. Whereas not everyone has every spiritual gift, every believer is expected to exhibit the spiritual fruit. (2 Corinthians 3:17; John 16:7-13, 14:16,17; Acts 1:8; 1 Corinthians 2:12, 3:16; Ephesians 1:13; Galatians 5:19-26; Ephesians 4:7-13)

ABOUT MAN

Man is created as a whole being consisting of spirit, soul, and body. He is the spiritual image of God. Man is to be like Him in character. He is the supreme object of God's creation. Although man has tremendous potential for good, he is marred by an attitude of disobedience towards God called "sin". This attitude separates man from God. (Genesis 1:27; Psalm 8:3-6; Isaiah 53:6a; Romans 3:23; Isaiah 59:1, 2; 1Thessalonians 5:23)

ABOUT ETERNITY

Man was created to exist forever. He will either exist eternally separated from God by sin, or in union with God through forgiveness and salvation. To be eternally separated from God is Hell. To be eternally in union with Him is eternal life. Heaven and Hell are of eternal existence. (John 3:16; 1 John 2:25; Romans 6:23; Revelation 20:15; 1 John 5:11-12; Matthew 25:31-46)

ABOUT SALVATION

Salvation is a gift by grace from God to man. Man can never make up for his sin by self-improvement or good works. Only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness can man be saved from sin's penalty. Eternal life begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ into his life by grace through faith. All believers have direct access to God through Jesus Christ. (Romans 6:23; Ephesians 2:8,9; John 3:3; John 3:16; John 14:6, 1:12; Titus 3:5-6; Galatians 3:26; Romans 5:1)

ABOUT ETERNAL SECURITY

Because God gives man eternal life through Jesus Christ, the believer is secure in salvation for eternity. Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by the self-effort of the Christian. It is the grace and keeping power of God that gives this security. (John 10:29; 2 Timothy 1:12; Hebrews 7:25; Hebrews 10:10&14; 1 Peter 1:3-5.)

ABOUT THE BIBLE

The Bible is God's inspired word to all men. It was written by human authors, under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is the supreme source of truth for Christian beliefs and living. (2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20, 21; 2 Timothy 1:13; Psalm 119:105.160, 12:6; Proverbs 30:5)

ABOUT THE ORDINANCES OF THE CHURCH

We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ appointed two ordinances, Baptism and the Lord's Supper, to be observed as acts of obedience and as continual witnesses to the foundational facts of the Christian faith; that Baptism is the immersion of the believer in water as a confession of identification with Christ in burial and resurrection. We believe that the Lord's Supper is the partaking of bread and fruit of the vine as symbolic of the Saviour's broken body and spilled blood, in remembrance of His sacrificial death till He comes again.

(Matthew 28:18-20; Romans 6:3-5; Acts 2:38-41; I Corinthians 11:23-26)

ABOUT CHRISTIAN CONDUCT

We believe that a Christian should live for the glory of God and the well-being of his fellow man; that his conduct should be blameless before the world; that he should be a faithful steward of his possessions; and that he should seek to realize for himself and others the full stature of maturity in Christ. (I Corinthians 10:31; Romans 12:1-3; Hebrews 12:1-2; John 14:15,23-24; I John 2:3-6; II Corinthians 9:6-9; I Corinthians 4:2; Col. 1:9-10)

APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

Having received Christ as my Lord and Saviour and having been baptized afterwards by immersion as a believer, and being in agreement with the church's statements, strategy, and structure, I now feel led by the Holy Spirit to unite with the church family.
